You will have 30hours (15 classes + CLES) devoted to English. Attendance is **compulsory** (more than 2 unjustified absences = zero for the final grade).

Objectives

Operational linguistic and organisational skills: B2 level within the framework of the European Council - which corresponds to CLES 2, which you will be sitting on **16 February 2010**.

Your organisational skills (classification and prioritisation of information, synthesis, team work, etc.) must back up your linguistic skills (oral and written comprehension + oral and written expression). In other words, you must be able to use your English in situations close to those you will meet in "real life".

You will reinforce strategies for :

- listening focusing on stressed syllables, weak forms, diphthongs, etc.
- written comprehension key words and link words
- transmitting information orally or in written text synthesis, letters, abstracts, etc
- explaining clear, organised viewpoints on a topical issue giving the advantages and drawbacks of various options.
- **oral communication skills for public speaking** -- using notes only, as opposed to reading a text -- paying attention to body language, eye contact, etc.
- negotiating solutions and solving problems
- teamwork.
